SENIOR SCRATCH CUP – SATURDAY 14 AUGUST, 2010.

INFORMATION FOR COMPETITORS

Our Senior Scratch Cup, kindly sponsored by TopGolfer.ie, will be played over 36 Holes on Saturday, 14th August with a two tee start on the 1st and 10th for both rounds. Competitors who start from the 1st Tee in the first round will start from the 10th tee in the second round and vice versa.

Competitors should check in at the Spike Bar in the downstairs lobby at least twenty minutes before their morning Tee Time.

If for any reason a competitor cannot make it on the morning please telephone, as early as possible, the Pro-Shop on 01 276 3200 Ext. 2, or the Competitions Chairman, Marcus Hunt, on (087) 244 7627.

In the interest of ensuring that the competition runs in a smooth and timely manner Bray Golf Club has in place timekeeping and Pace of Play regulations which are set out below:

1. Competitors must present themselves to the Starter adjacent to the first or tenth tee not later than five minutes prior to their schedule Tee Time for each round.
2. Any competitor arriving at his first tee after his schedule playing partners have driven off and left the teeing area is automatically disqualified.
3. Competitors are expected to play at a good pace and to keep up with the group in front of it. They should be ready to play as soon as it is their turn to play while bags or trollies should be left adjacent to the exit point from each green prior to players putting. Failure to do so shall be deemed to be contributing to slow play and undue delay.
4. The target times for completion of holes are:

	Starting on:	1st Tee	10th Tee
Through the:	4 th	50 minutes	13 th 50 Minutes
	9 th	2 hours	18 th 2 hours
	13 th	2 hours 50 minutes	4 th 2 hours 50 minutes
	18 th	4 hours	9 th 4 hours

The maximum time allowed for completion of 18 holes is 4 hours 15 minutes.

Committee members will be carrying out spot checks throughout the day. If, after an initial warning, there is no improvement in the next sector then each member of the group will be penalised one stroke for the first offence and two further strokes for a second offence, unless a particular individual, or individuals, is/are identified as being responsible for the delay, in which case the penalty will only apply to the individual(s) concerned.

5. If a group is delayed then they will have to cut their lunch break as no allowance will be made for late arrival on their first tee for the second round.
6. In the event of inclement weather causing a suspension of play for a period then the timetable will be adjusted for such suspension period and the competitors affected advised accordingly.
7. The Committee may adjust these conditions on the day should they deem it appropriate to do so.

Assuming there are no undue delays we would expect prizegiving will take place in the upstairs lounge at 20.00 approximately.

Soup and sandwiches and tea or coffee will be provided in the Spike Bar downstairs after the first round.
